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End of Key Stage One Assessments (SATs)

It is a statutory requirement for all Year Two children in England to take two reading tests and a maths reasoning and arithmetic test during the month of May. Unlike the Year 6 tests we can administer these tests on any day and so that children remain as relaxed as possible they will just find out a few minutes before they complete the test. Our previous experience administering these tests is that many of the children like completing the tests and enjoy the extra playtime that comes after completing a test! All of the Year Two children have already completed previous Year Two Sats papers as advised by the Local Education Authority and we hope you agree this hasn't seemed to have phased them. Please could you let the office know if your child has any appointments or holidays booked that would mean they will not be in school.

Science Update

On the 17th May, some of our Key Stage 2 children will take part in a very exciting opportunity as they work with Durham University on its launch of their brand new exhibition, Wild. After the success of our last visit to experience the university's Catch Your Breath exhibit, the children from Coxhoe were specifically requested for the launch.

The exhibition focuses on British wildlife and has been created with many additional groups, including Durham Wildlife. Twelve children will be taken to the exhibition and be the very first people to try out the activities and help create online videos and posters to promote it.

EY playground

Exciting news – the next phase of our EY playground development is underway. The piece of climbing equipment has been installed and the playground markings added. The outdoor shelter and other finishing touches are planned for the next two weeks and we hope to have a launch party to celebrate very soon – watch this space!

Plan to develop outdoors – Playground Squad

Our Playground Squad have liaised with their class to review the whole of our outdoor area and how it is used. They have been absolutely amazing in what they have brought forward – the insightful and creative ideas are helping us to create a very exciting long term plan.

The shorter term goals include new rules introduced, shared and displayed appropriately, an area fenced of for additional ball sports, new sheds and re-launch of the current shed as a quiet area, no football areas, outdoor seating to allow children to have lunch outside on nice days. The children have proposed that this is based upon a pass system and used as a reward.

The longer term goals include re-surfacing of the older tarmac areas, playground markings to encourage play and learning, re-siting of tyre park, replace and re-site adventure playground with equipment made to be used all year round.

We have shared an outline of this with the PTA and requested their support. We will formalise the action plan into phases and work with PTA and the local community to raise funds. If you can help or are aware of anyone who can help – please let us know.
