Our new Audio Visual equipment has now been installed and has been used by Class 8, Class 10, Class 11 and Class 5 to produce some fantastic assemblies.

We have had some super power point presentations which have included learning about some of their aspirations and the water cycle (which involved a very large confetti cannon).

The addition of this equipment is going to be a great asset that will be used for a variety of events:

Not everyone will have had the chance to see the new system in action yet but rest assured you're in for a treat.

A shockingly good investment

Work has now begun to source a defibrillator.

The government run a scheme which is specifically designed for schools, where defibrillators can be purchased at a subsidised price. This is currently our main line of enquiry.

Before one can be installed we need to carry out a risk assessment to determine the best location. The equipment needs to be easily accessible in the event of an emergency.

Some facts about sudden cardiac arrest:

- 270 children die in the UK every year after suffering a Sudden Cardiac Arrest at school.
- Without immediate treatment, 90-95% of Sudden Cardiac Arrest victims will die.
- If a defibrillator is used and effective CPR is performed within 3-5 minutes of cardiac arrest, their chance of survival increases from 6% to 74%.

I am sure you will agree it is going to be a valuable piece of equipment to have within school.

Pricey...but oh so worth it!

As a reward for all of their effort every child in school received a one of a kind medal designed to commemorate their achievement.

We want the children to look back on their time at Coxhoe Primary School and remember amazing accomplishments such as this.

The medals cost a little more than normal, but the smiles and pride on the children's faces made it worthwhile.

We have taken on board feedback given at a PTA meeting and will consider all opinions for rewards at future events.

Community Spirit

The event has been an invaluable way to get many different people from the community involved in achieving our goal. We managed to beat our target and "travelled" all the way to the North Pole thanks to the miles clocked up by Park Runs, Marathons and scenic village runs.
