Dear Parents/Carers,

The children have continued with their fantastic start to the year and this is clear with their 'Dojo Points'. As a school, we have been reviewing the school behaviour policy and the new document is available on the school website. Many aspects of the policy have remained the same the card system, the school rules and the positive ethos that underpins all of the systems in place. However, in response to the children's feedback, we have changed some of the ways we reward children for positive behaviour. We have introduced an online system where children collect points both for themselves as individuals and towards a class goal too. Rewards are more frequent and build towards the chance to win larger rewards at the end of the year. At fifty individual points, children will receive a teacher treat and at 2000 class points, children will enjoy a class reward such as a film, PJ party, a sporting challenge, a walk to the park.... In Assembly every Friday – we will share class point totals in order to further motivate children. At the end of each term, the top three point scorers will also enjoy a special reward together. We launched the new system just after half term and have been delighted with the positive response from the children. The system will be reviewed at the end of each term and adjustments made to ensure it is fair and consistent as well as having a positive impact. Please feel free to share any feedback yourselves as the new system is embedded. We believe that rewarding positive behaviour is a key part of ensuring that standards remain high across all aspects of school life. Visitors often comment on the high standards of behaviour and the beautiful manners of our children and this makes us very proud – we are sure you do too.

We are looking forward to a lovely Coxhoe Family Christmas and preparations are already underway. It is always a busy time so keep an eye on the App for reminders to help keep you up to date.

I hope that you will join me in giving Mr Coils, our new school caretaker, a lovely welcome. He started last week and is finding his way around.

## Vacancy for Parent Governor – exciting opportunity

The Governing Body of Coxhoe Primary School has a vacancy for a parent Governor. This is an exciting opportunity for parents to become involved in shaping the future of our school: Please contact Mrs Bartle to find out more about the role and collect a nomination form.

There will be a vacancy for a Parent Governor with immediate effect.

All parents other than those employed at the school for more than 500 hours per year or who are elected members of the Local Authority (LA) are eligible to stand for election. This includes:

- > parents of children attending nursery either full-time or part-time
- > any person who is not the natural parent but has parental responsibility for or who has care of a pupil registered at the school (Education Act 1996, Section 576)

If you are interested in becoming a Governor please contact school for a nomination form.

Nominees must be proposed by a parent of a pupil registered at the school.

A parent may nominate his/her partner.

The completed and duly signed nomination form should be returned to school by Monday 26<sup>th</sup> November.

Where the number of nominations is equal to, or fewer than, the places available no ballot will be necessary. Any remaining vacancies will be appointed by our Governing Body.

Should a ballot be required each parent will be sent a voting form.

When the process has been finalised school will inform the parent body via our school app. School and Governor Support Service will write formally to all nominees confirming the outcome of the ballot.

#### Remembrance Events in Coxhoe

We were very proud of the contribution made by our pupils to the wonderful remembrance events in our Village. In school all classes spent some time exploring different aspects of WW1 and 2 and produced some wonderful creative work to mark this event. We held our own remembrance service in school on Friday where the children were able to share what they had learned with one another as well as holding a two minutes silence to remember those who have given their lives for us.

We were also invited by the Parish Council to join with the Village Remembrance events. Children laid the poppy wreath at the memorial and helped with laying a cross to represent each fallen soldier of WW1. They also supported at the special event on the evening to commemorate the 100 years since the end of WW1. Children presented a beautiful memorial poppy to Pam Royle who attended the events after they had been involved in reading the names of the soldiers and lighting the Beacons which was a national event.

The Parish Council spoke very highly of all children involved and all those who also attended with their families. Thank you.

The exhibition is part of a five year research project taking place at the university which explores all aspects of breath and breathlessness and the important role these play in our lives.
