## **SEND Team Update**

Question of the month: My child has been added to the SEND Register. What does this mean?

Children are added to the SEND register in consultation with parents, teacher and SENCO. Your child may have some areas which they are struggling with and need further support; this would be over and above what is usually common practice in the classroom. Your child will have a SEN support plan outlining the areas of need. Each need will have a small step outcome and provision to show how the outcome will be met. These are working documents used by all staff working with your child and enable your child to make small steps progress in whatever area of need they have.

## Sports Report

We are looking forward to lots of upcoming sport events this year. Class 3 have participated in a Multi Skills festival already this week and our swimmers are taking part in the Swimming Gala.

We held an assembly this week where the children discussed Olympic values and how we could use them across all of our learning. ## **Online Safety**

Safer Internet Day is fast approaching and we are excited to welcome Martin Bailey back into school on February 14<sup>th</sup>. Martin will be delivering a parent workshop at 9am where you will also be entertained by our KS2 children. We hope to see you all there.

We are delighted to announce that National Online Safety have just released their brand-new platform, and as a Certified School – our whole school community has now received a complimentary upgrade to their new website. This is a fantastic opportunity to ensure we all stay up-to-date with the latest changes to online safety.

## **SMART Watches**

In the interest of Safeguarding and Health and Safety, we operate a no jewellery policy this includes Smartwatches which are not allowed in school. This is for a variety of reasons as staff are unable to monitor them closely enough to ensure they are being used safely. If your child is wearing a SMART watch for school, it will be taken from them and kept in a safe place (in the office) until an adult collects it. However, in line with our passion for helping children to tell the time and our approach to healthy schools, a standard wrist watch or a simple fitness tracker may be worn. The school cannot accept any responsibility for loss or damage. If you are unsure whether your child's watch is appropriate, please speak to Mrs Bartle or Miss Marsden.

## **Snacks and packed lunches**

Promoting ways to stay healthy is currently a focus for our School Council. They have some super plans, including a healthy tuckshop. We would love to have parent ideas as to what would be popular – please let us know by chatting to us on the yard or emailing into the office. The children will have their chance to share their ideas through the school council.

Sweets/chocolate and crisps are not permitted as a snack. We encourage children to bring fruit or other healthy options such as low sugar cereal bars, cheese cubes etc. Children in KS1 are provided with fruit daily; this is provided by the government scheme. However, they may bring their own fruit too if they have a particular preference or an alternative healthy snack.

Packed Lunches should not include any fizzy drinks or sweets. In the past, we have asked that parents include a plastic bag for all the rubbish from a packed lunch. This has then been taken home so that parents are aware of any food that has been left. In response to feedback from some parents we will trial moving forward and children will put their rubbish such as fruit peel/yoghurt pots from packed lunches in the bin. However, this will be monitored by the lunchtime team and it will be kept if a child is leaving food regularly. Staff will liaise with parents if they notice this and if parents have a concern please make sure that you make your child's teacher aware.

## **TT Rockstars**

Classes 5-12 have been taking part in class battles on TT Rockstars.
Classes have been working cooperatively with their peers to complete as many questions as possible on TT Rockstars in their spare time. Each winning class will earn a whole class dojo. It has been wonderful to see the children so enthusiastic about their times tables. The competition is on!
