September Planning

Wider opening in June was a difficult time with intricate planning to reduce risks alongside providing a welcoming environment for our children. We know that it was not easy for parents too and we are very appreciative of the way that they have followed such stringent guidance to help keep everyone in our school family safe.

September is likely to bring mixed emotions for everyone. I know that staff are really excited about being back in their classrooms with their children - doing what they love. I know that children will be keen to be back at school with their Coxhoe family - we know from your feedback how much they have missed it too. I know that parents are looking forward to some routine back in their lives.

However, we do understand that everyone will have worries about the full re-opening of school. A thorough risk assessment is currently underway and new routines to support this will be put into place. As you will understand, this is a lengthy process if it is to be completed thoroughly and collaboratively. By working together, we can significantly reduce risks to keep everyone in our school family safe. Both the government and the Local Authority have provided guidance in recent days and this will no doubt be updated in the coming weeks with current information. We therefore intend to provide a detailed leaflet to offer guidance to parents by Wednesday 26th of August. We are exploring as many different ideas as possible to support both social distancing and enhanced cleaning. Please bear with us as we continue to prepare.

In order to help with planning, we can share the following key information:

- A phased approach is planned for September to ensure that children settle in well and understand the essential new routines and rules. We have a CPD day on 1/9/20. Y5&6 children will return to school on 2/9/20. Y3 & 4 children will return to school on 3/9/20. Year 1 & 2 children will return to school on 4/9/20. Reception children will be visiting school with their parents throughout this first week but will not begin school until 7/9/20.
- Staggered start/end time families with surnames A- 8.35-8.50 start & 3.00pm finish; families with surnames 8.50 9.05 and a 3.15 finish. Childminders and nurseries who drop off/pick up multiple children will be allocated a set time.
- All PE is outdoors school PE kit is compulsory (see website) and all children must have long bottoms. Coats may also be worn if necessary. Each bubble will have a PE day - and children will wear their PE kit for school. This will eliminate the need for PE kits to be stored in school and getting changed at school.
- Children must not bring pencil cases/stationery from home. We are exploring an individual pack for each child with all of the essentials.
- Children will be allowed to bring a packed lunch into school but we do ask that this is wiped clean every day and washed thoroughly each week.

Home School Communication

You will no doubt have many questions and we are keen to keep channels of communication open. There will be lots of good practice that can come from this very difficult situation. The shared mailboxes are one of these: they will continue to provide an easy way for you to ask questions/share information with your child's class teacher. This will be helpful for parents who do not drop off or collect their children. Face to face meetings will not be possible in the Autumn term - although we will review this regularly. Brief messages can be shared face to face outdoors, such as passing over a first aid slip. We stress that we are always still very keen to talk to you about any concerns and telephone meetings can be arranged promptly.

If you have questions about the re-opening, please feel free to email over the holiday period. As an SLT, we will continue to review the documents, and plan so please bear with us. The mailboxes will be monitored regularly over the holidays, as are the answerphones. Please let us know if you have any concerns as this may feed into our risk assessment and practical planning for the new school year.

Sporting Update

During the school closure I have been delighted to see and hear many of us having been keeping active. We have recreated famous sporting moments, held our own sports days and completed orienteering challenges around the local area.
